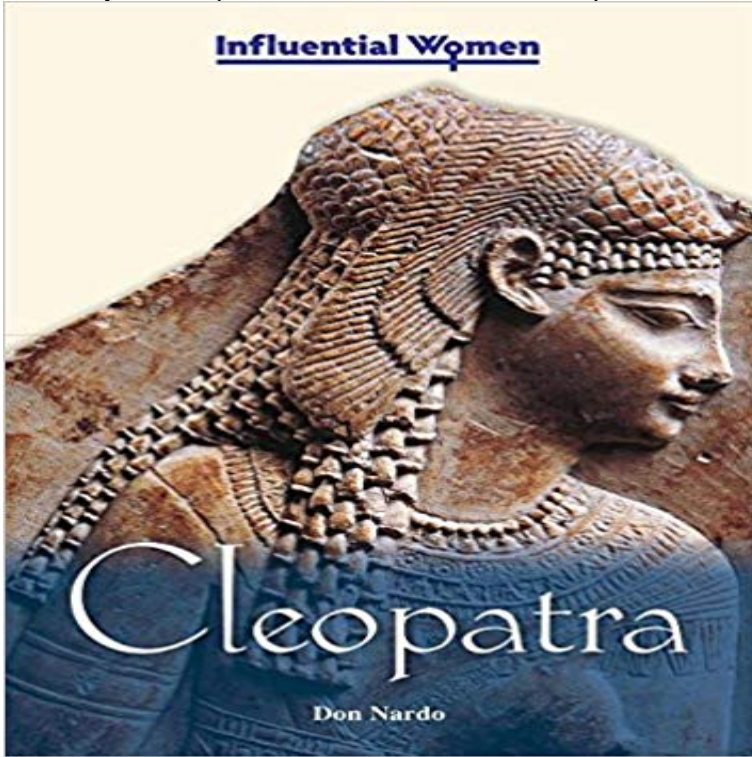


Cleopatra (Influential Women)
