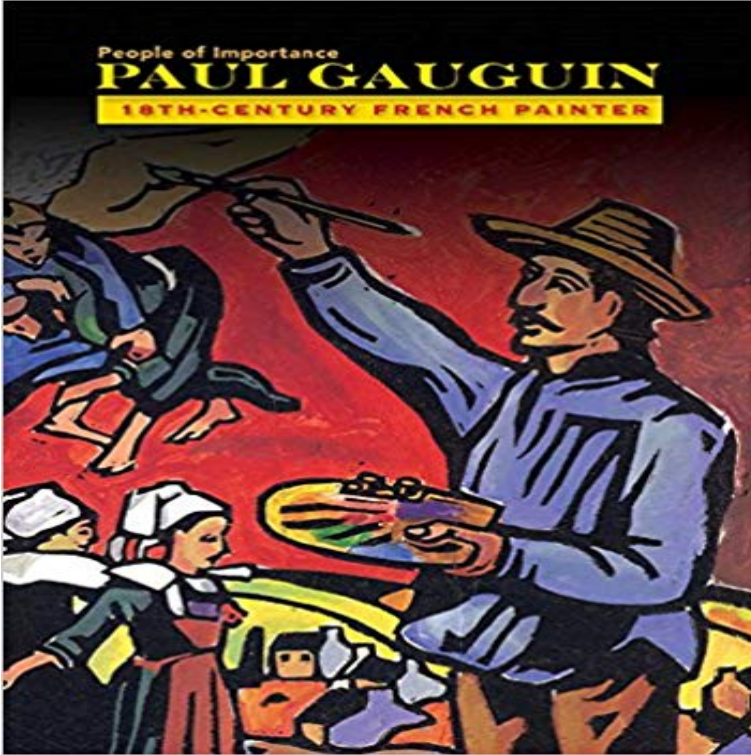


Paul Gauguin: 19th-Century French Painter
