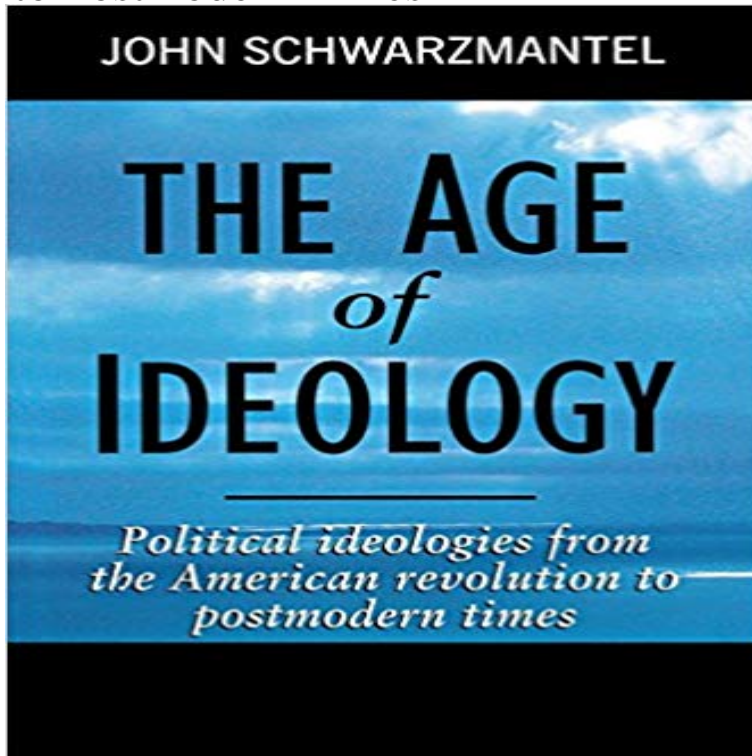


The Age of Ideology: Political Ideologies from the American Revolution to Postmodern Times
