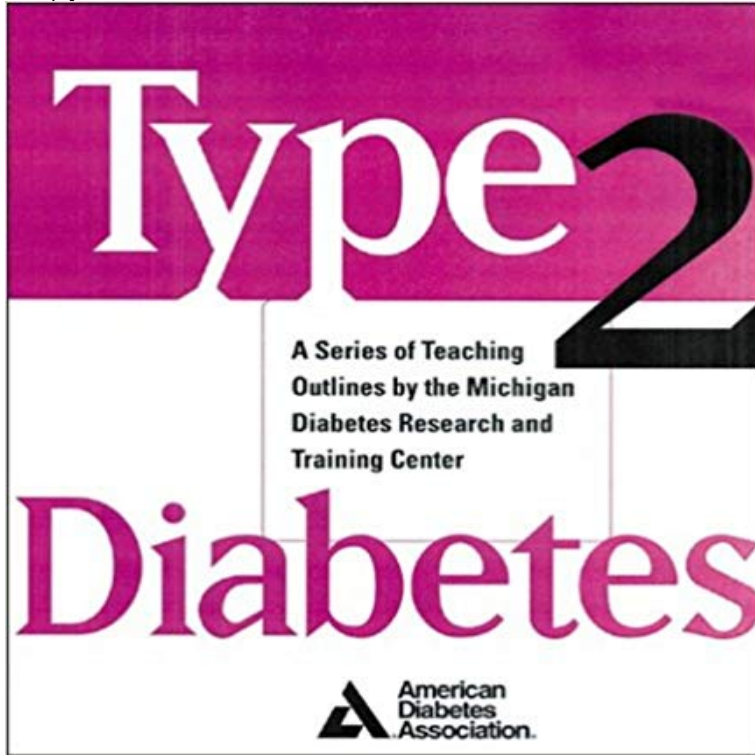


Type 2 Diabetes : A Curriculum for Patients and Health Professionals
