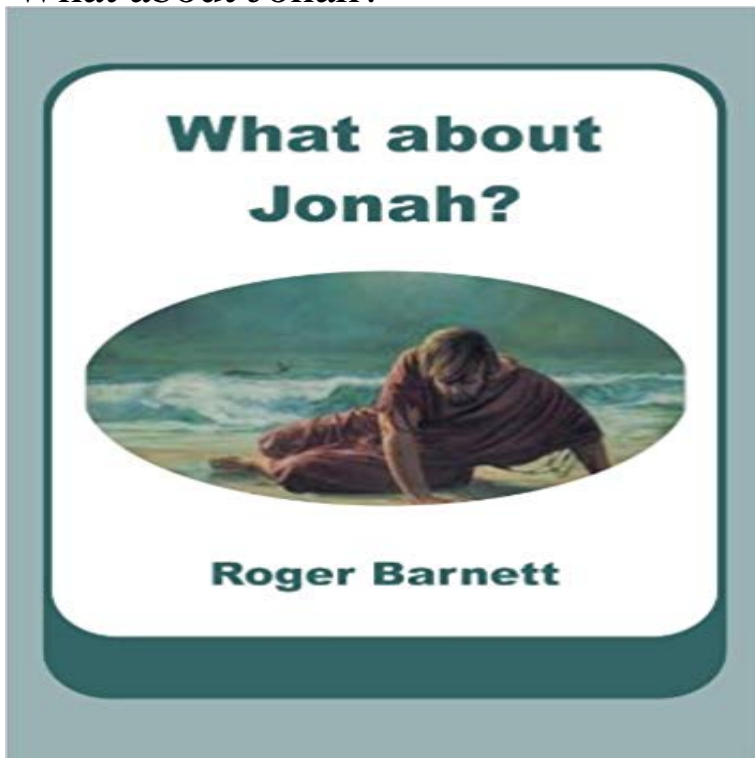


What about Jonah?
