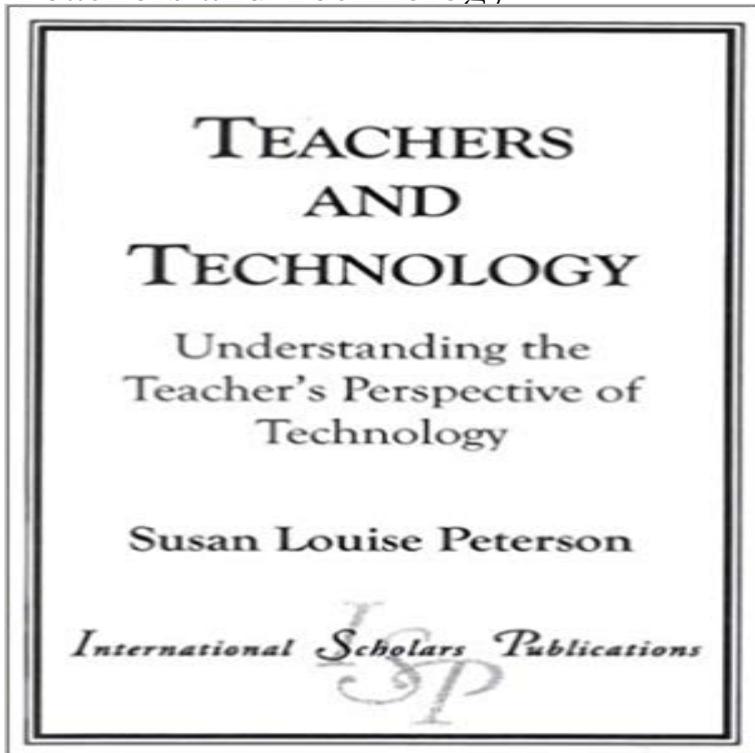


Teachers and Technology
