


Prostate Cancer: The Life and Times of a Survivor

He took early retirement aged 61, and seven years later following regular tests was diagnosed with early prostate cancer and treated by Radical Prostatectomy (surgical removal of the gland). Following this treatment the majority of patients make a full recovery within two years. The writer though was less fortunate in suffering from side effects to an extreme degree, the worst case scenario, and as a result required further treatment. In his humorous poetic style he gives a brief introduction to urology and his life before cancer followed by an account of his experience of being diagnosed with the cancer, undergoing the treatments, and how he dealt with the ensuing problems.
