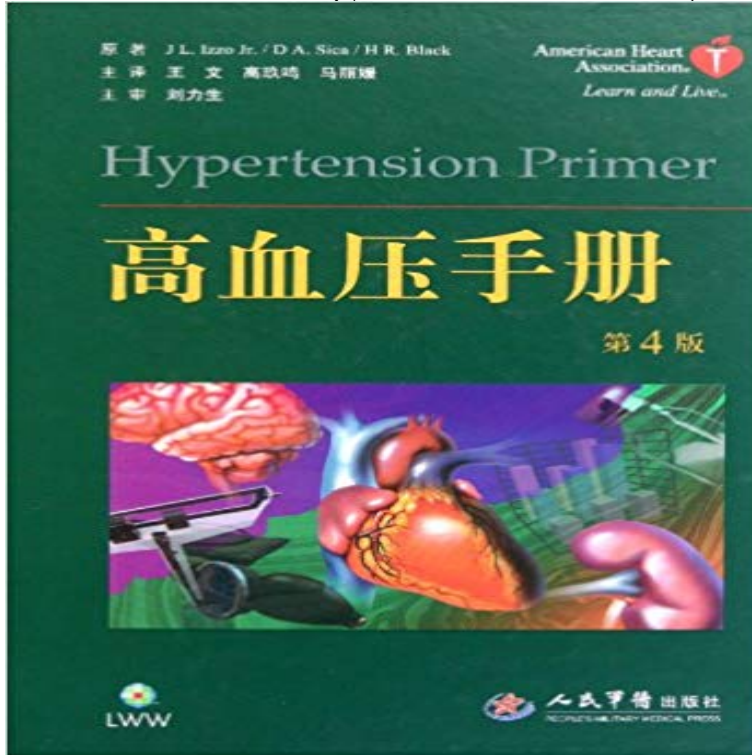


Handbook on High Blood Pressure, 4th Edition (Chinese Edition)
