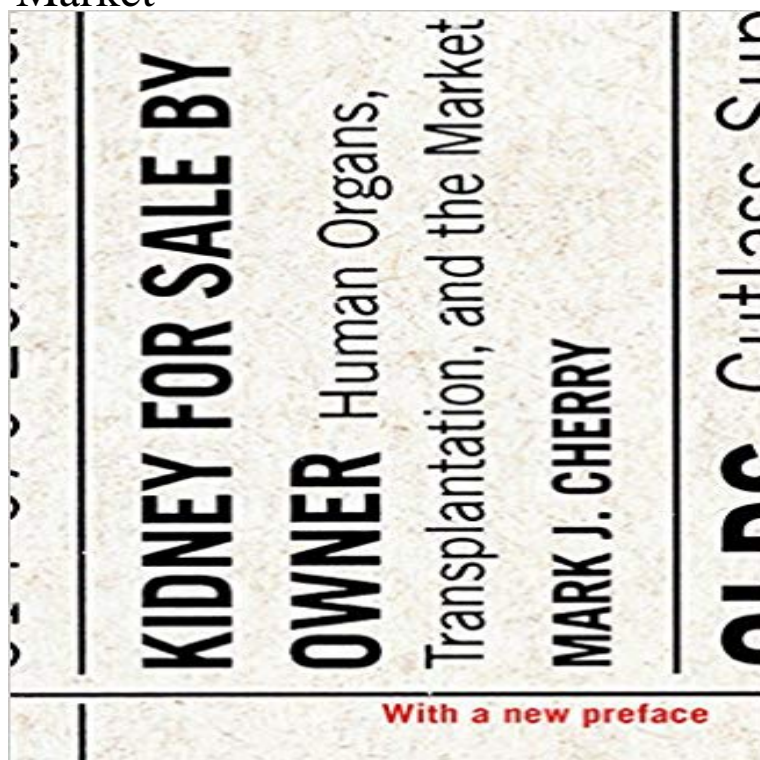


Kidney for Sale by Owner: Human Organs, Transplantation, and the Market
