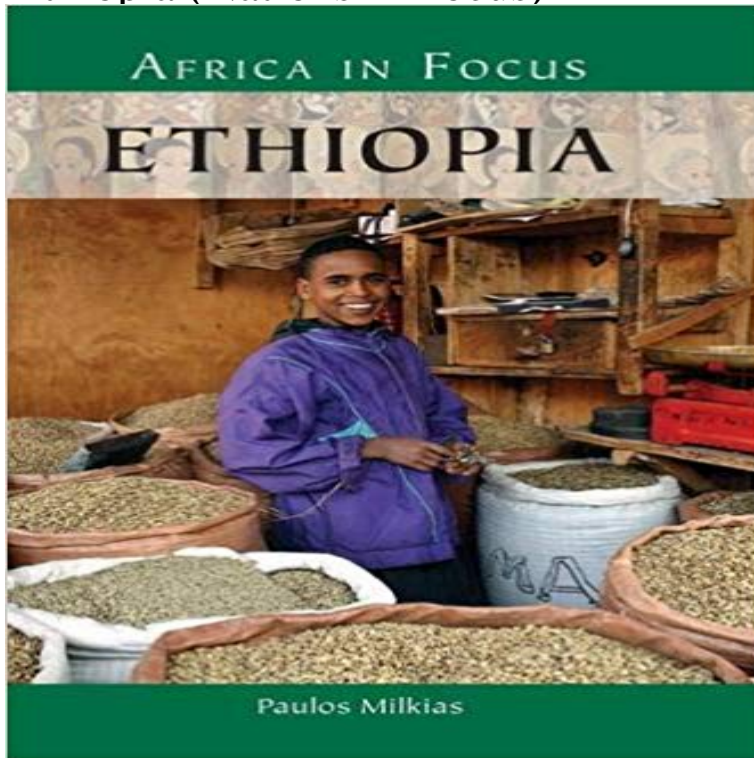


Ethiopia (Nations in Focus)
