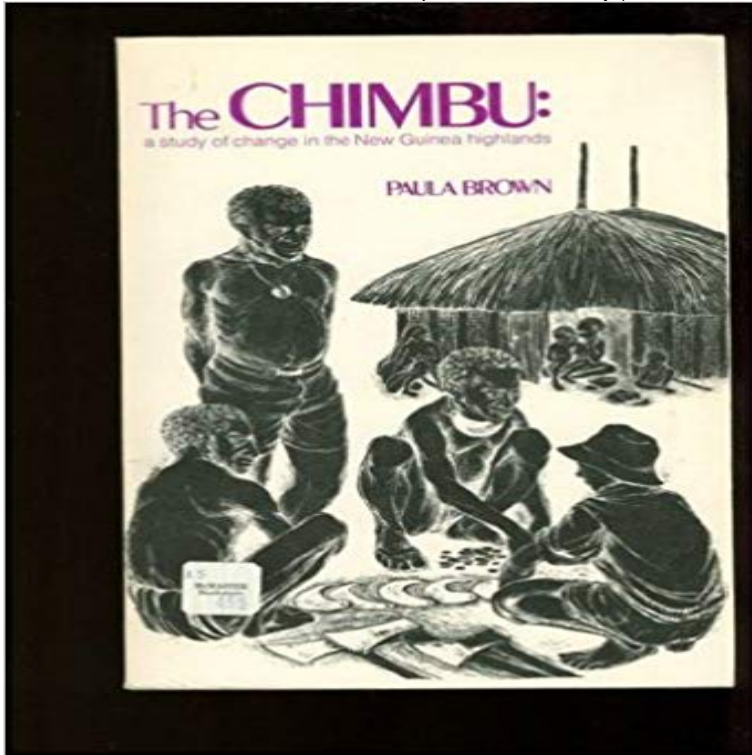


The Chimbu: A Study of Change in the New Guinea Highlands
