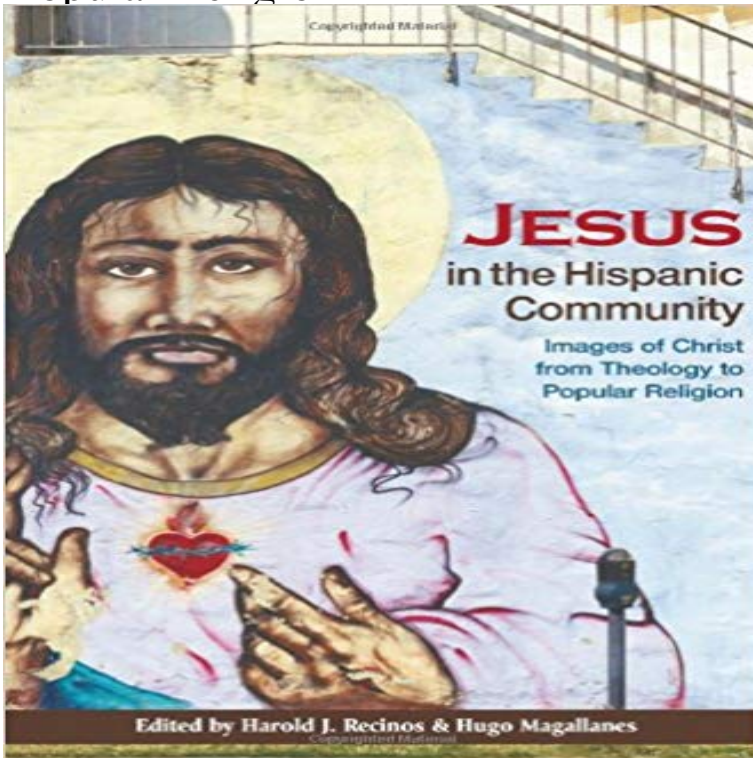


Jesus in the Hispanic Community: Images of Christ from Theology to Popular Religion
