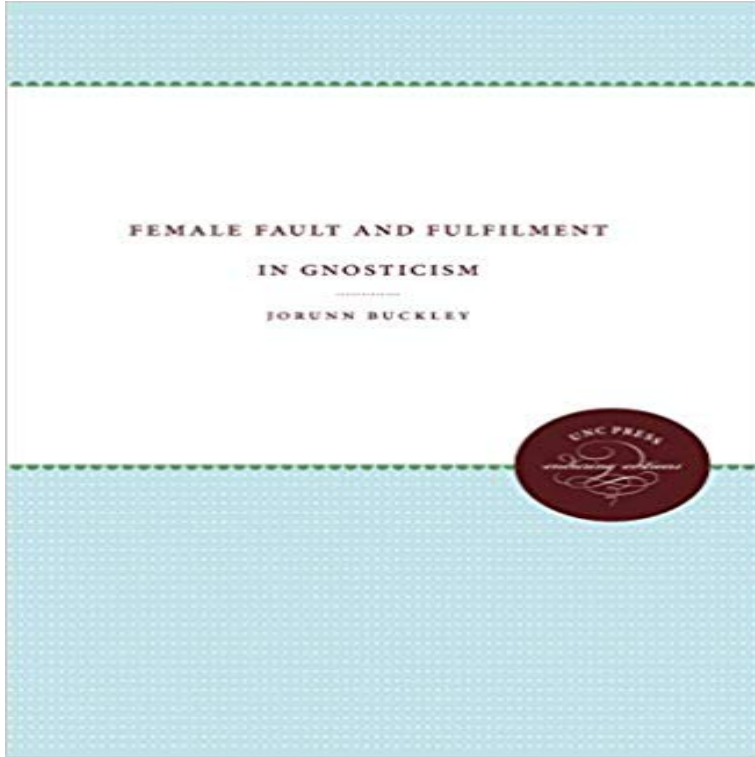


Female Fault and Fulfilment in Gnosticism (Studies in Religion)
