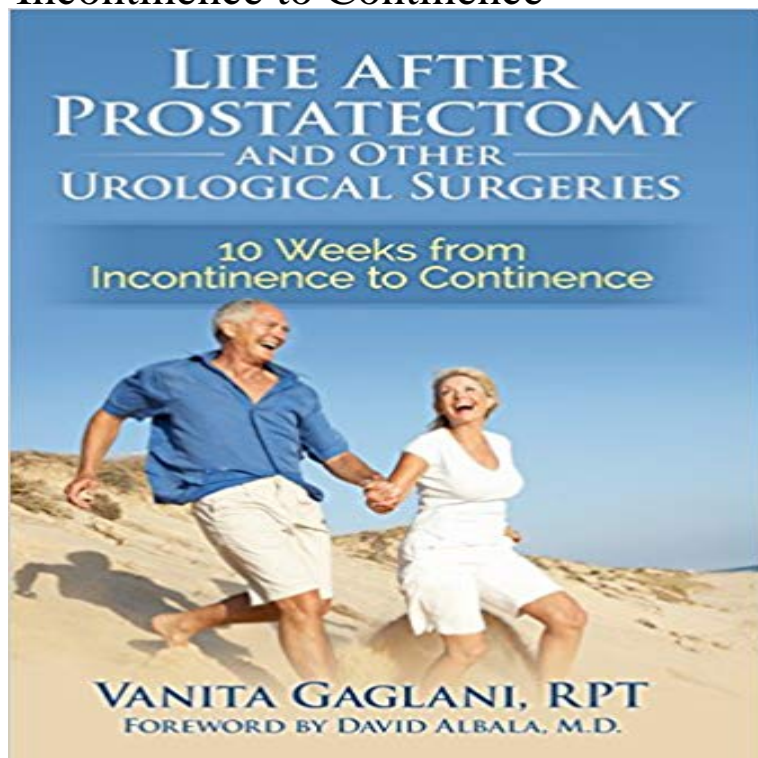


# Life after Prostatectomy and Other Urological Surgeries: 10 Weeks from Incontinence to Continence
