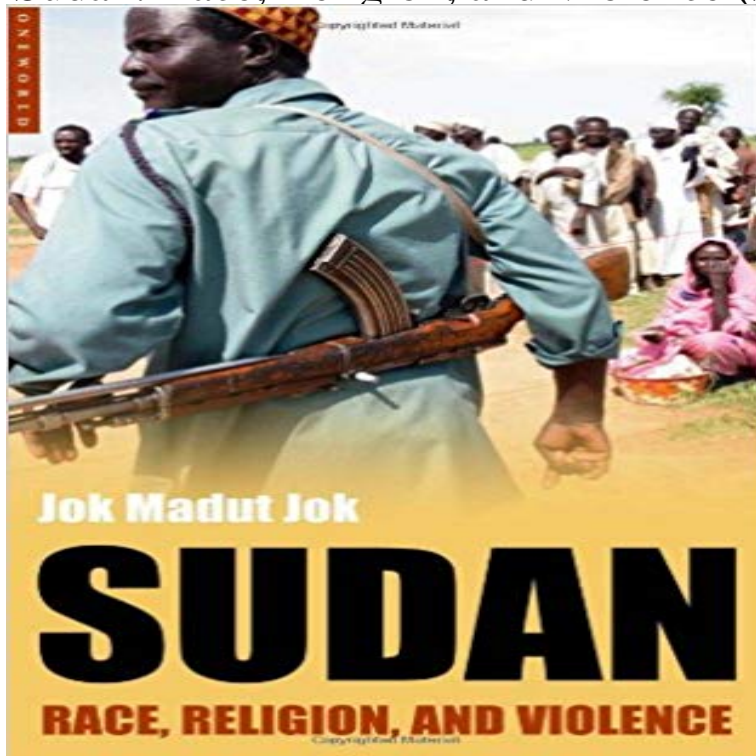


Sudan: Race, Religion, and Violence (Short Histories)
