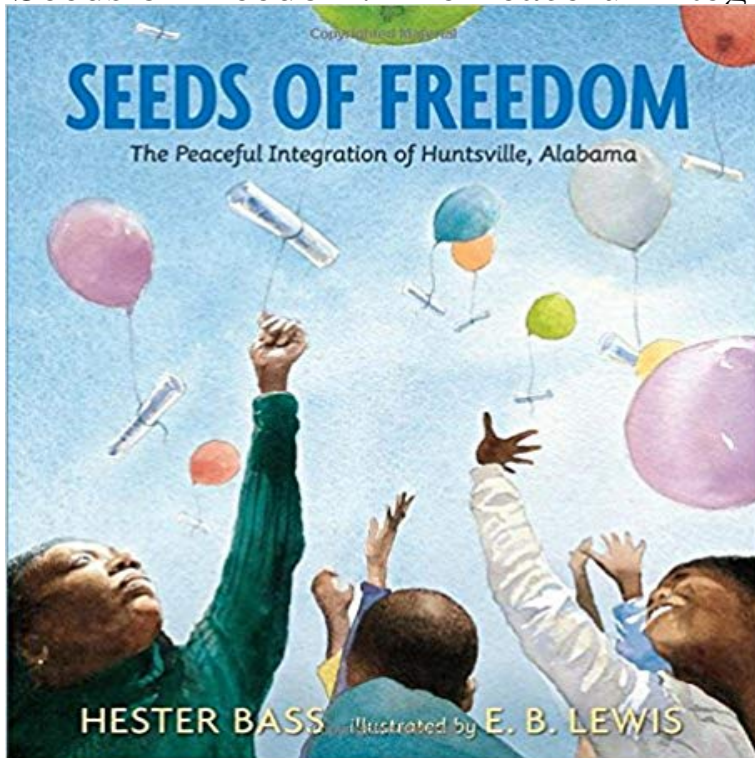


# Seeds of Freedom: The Peaceful Integration of Huntsville, Alabama
