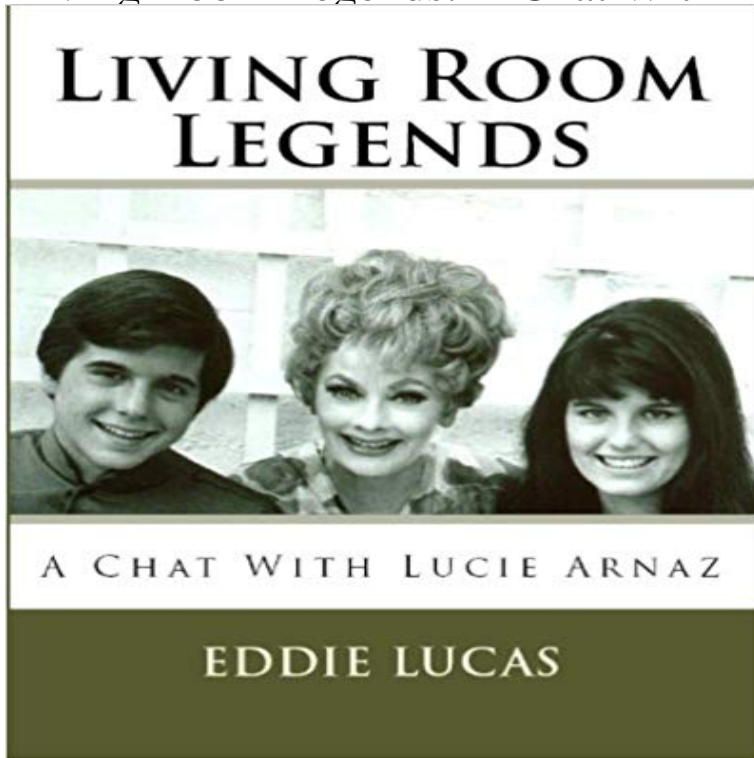


Living Room Legends: A Chat With Lucie Arnaz
