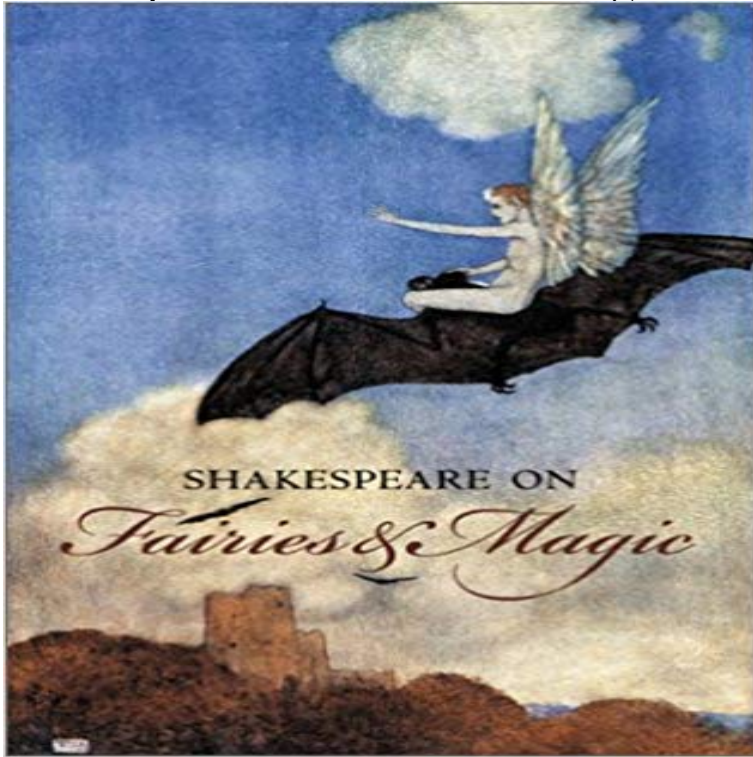


## Shakespeare on Fairies and Magic
