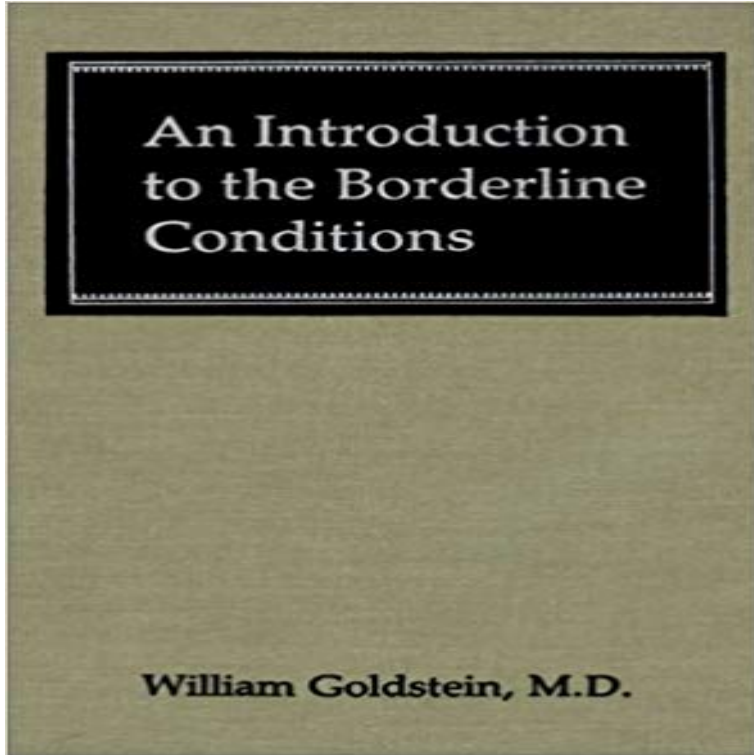


An Introduction to the Borderline Conditions
