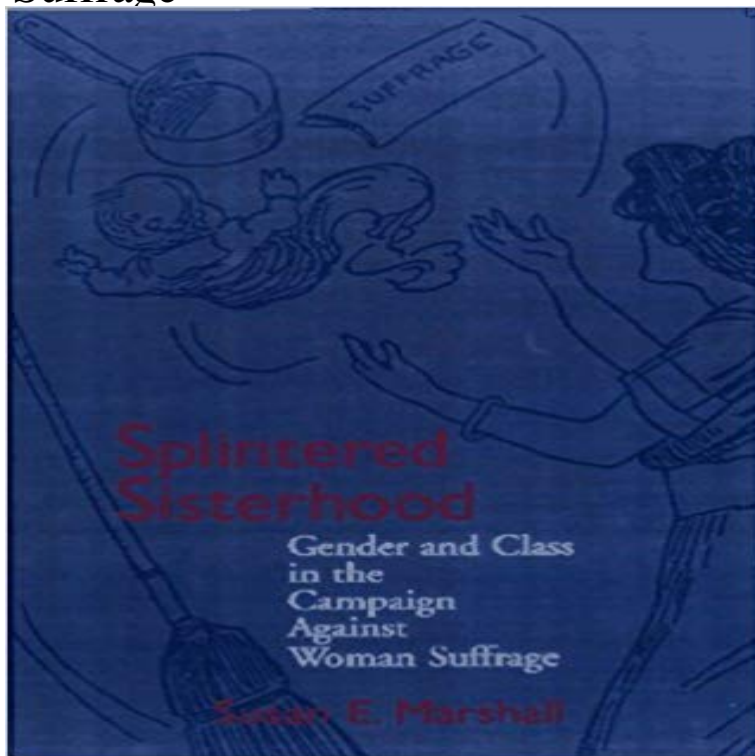


Splintered Sisterhood: Gender and Class in the Campaign against Woman Suffrage
