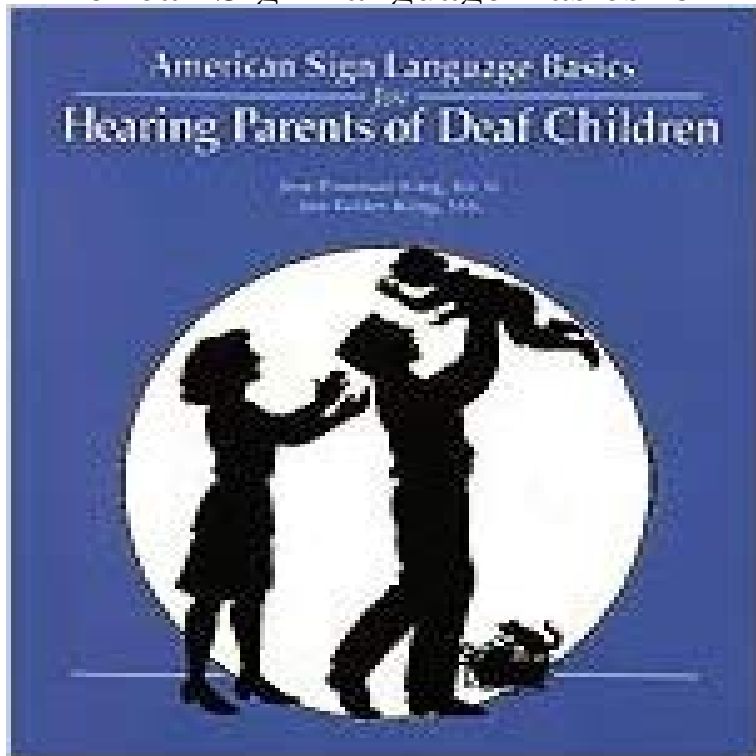


American Sign Language Basics for Hearing Parents of Deaf Children
