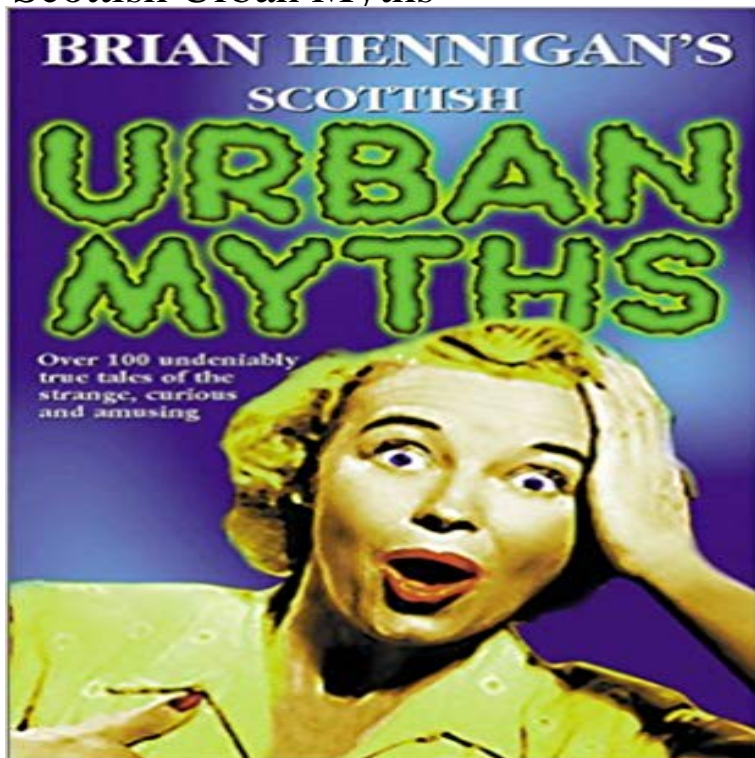


Scottish Urban Myths
