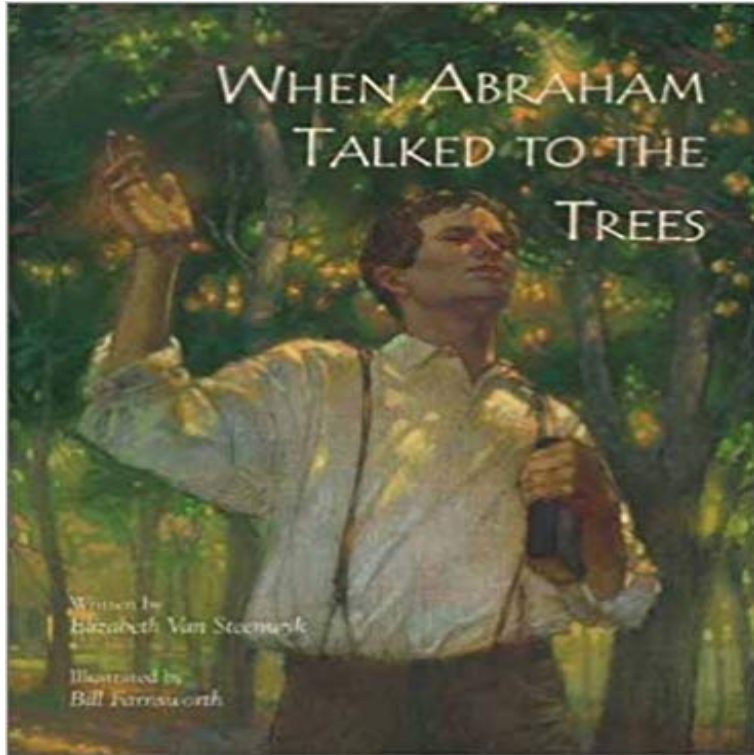


When Abraham Talked to the Trees
